
Part I Reflections

Last year I received the following email "letter" from a Knight of Columbus contact. It illustrates the sad state we are in today when it comes to celebrating the birth of Jesus. The miracle of long ago continues today. The promise made long ago is valid today. It isn't a maudlin feel-good season, although there is no harm in feeling good. It isn't one big shopping spree that gets launched at the conclusion of Halloween, although consuming in a reasonable way is good and keeps people gainfully employed. Do we keep the right priorities in our haste to prepare for the "festivities"?

Students could be asked to simply reflect on the readings and to draw personal meaning from them. For example, the quotes could reveal the theology of the event, or the family aspect, or the sentimentality associated with it. The "letter from Jesus" could stimulate thinking about what may be forgotten amidst all

the hoopla or why many do not answer His invitation. The energy, time and thought given over to extravagant gift giving should remind us of God's infinite extravagance in giving us Jesus, His own Son. What more could anyone ask for?






